

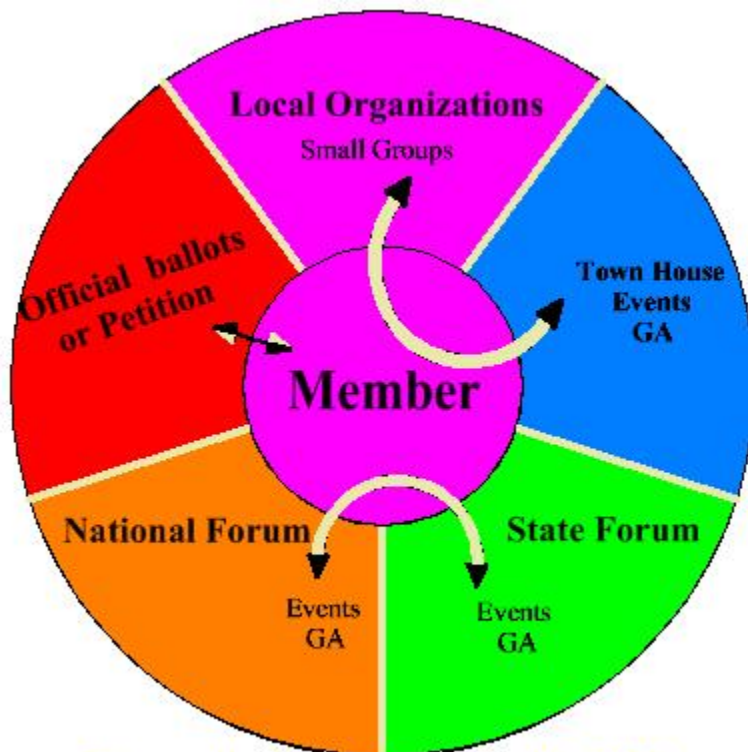
What is Public Voice?

Public-Voice is an International Institution integrating completely independent National Forums. To simplify this discussion, we will consider only the USA National Forum.

The Public Voice USA Forum is a National Institution based on individual State Forums that are composed of Local Groups geographically located by County. We are a not-for-profit organization in compliance with Civic Leagues and Social Welfare code.

Our Mission demands that we don't merely discuss changes for the wellbeing of our communities but participate in making change. We do not *persuade* the government. We empower the People to enforce laws and actions that impose government accountability and actions.

- Our Members post proposals.
 - Candidates may post specific items of their platform for member's approval (vote or Poll.)
- Our staff converts them into Initiatives, Petitions, or Amendment.
- Our members, via local group activities, promote the measure via Internet, demonstrations, and rallies.
- Public-Voice collects online legal signatures to support the posting in Official Ballots.
- Our members, via local group activities, promote the measure via demonstrations, email, and rallies to reach those who are not yet members.
- Public-Voice exposes the proposal via the Internet providing data for non-committed voters to make logical decisions.
- Public-Voice agents seek Public Television, talk shows, and news media to gain access to the popular vote, inclusive to those who disagree with the proposal.

Democratic process

The member, as an individual or in small groups, is the strength of the community. Small groups are easy to operate as a Townhouse and use the power of Public's Voice platform, which directly affects the General Assembly (GA). Without Public Voice, imagine the pending anarchy resulting from GA depending

on physical meetings with thousands of members. Imagine the unfairness to those who may not be able to attend such physical meetings.

Each member is at the center of the Hub composing the Public Voice architecture. The member can interact with small groups and at any level of his or her choice. And, in ultimate analysis, most changes will only take place when the members approve official ballots or petitions.

Local organizations housing small groups determine the path of State and National Forums via the direct vote of the member.
